

Annual Report July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

As might be expected, fiscal year 2014 was a challenging year for Sportsmen Against Hunger (SDSAH.) Over the past 12 months, total meat donations declined from 68,843 pounds to 48,102 pounds. This is primarily due to the reduction in harvested antlerless deer last year.

Disease has been difficult on both East and West river deer populations the past 24 months. This situation has resulted in the reduction in the number of antlerless deer tags in South Dakota. West River deer tags for antlerless deer are expected to decrease by as much as 89% this upcoming hunting season!

Despite these challenges, SDSAH is committed to serving as the conduit between sportsmen and those needy families who can benefit from donated meat through a network of local food pantries. This system has proven to be effective. Only a few years ago (2010), South Dakota game meat donations represented nearly 25% of the total SAH game meat donations for the entire country!

Although we as an organization are very proud of this fact, we could not accomplish our mission alone. We depend on the support of those generous sportsmen who donate their wild game each year, as well as, those who donated their hard earned money though check off funds or individual support. Additionally, corporate sponsors continue to contribute cash donations reliably each year. Since our formation, South Dakota Game Fish and Parks Depoartment has provided both monetary support, as well as, consultative services to SDSAH. Equally noteworthy, countless processors throughout the state provide their time and skill at a reduced cost to help process donated meat.

Although challenging times may be upon us, I am confident these times will soon pass. Please consider supporting our mission by providing meat to those who need it most by:

- Making a cash or meat donation to Sportmen Against Hunger in 2014.
- Supporting the local "Clean out your Freezer" food drives in the fall of the year.
