I also wanted to extend a quick thank you to Matt Gassen. Most know Matt from his big smile and tireless efforts as the CEO of Feeding South Dakota. He was also a very active board member with Sportsmen Against Hunger. Matt recently retired from both Feeding South Dakota and SDSAH.

As you recall from last year's report, SDSAH surpassed 1-million pounds of donated meat. Quite a milestone! This organization has truly made a difference over the decades. Although we are proud of our achievements, the need continues. Inflation is at a 40-year high, and it isn't anticipated to subside for another year....maybe longer. This will almost certainly create headwinds for South Dakota families already battling food insecurity.

Last year, SDSAH provided over 18,000 pounds of lean protein to families facing food insecurity. This came from harvested wild game including deer, antelope, elk, Canada goose, rooster pheasants, and walleye. This was possible through our certificate program as well as generous donations from South Dakota sportsmen. Additional venison was also harvested from the Rapid City and Ellsworth Air Force Base deer reduction plans.

None of this could have been possible without the continued support of South Dakota Game, Fish, and Parks! Game, Fish, and Parks has been a steadfast supporter and fiscal partner for several years. Additionally, our mission could not have been accomplished without the logistical support from Feeding South Dakota and their network of agency partners. SDSAH has also been blessed by the private support from Scheels, Wal-Mart, The Elmen Foundation, First Premier Bank, and First Interstate Bank among many others (please see major donors.

Last but certainly not least, thank you to the processors who have been willing to work with us over the years. The processing and packaging of this valuable resource is not an easy job.

Again, thank you to all the supporters of this program. You make a difference in the lives of so many South Dakota families!!!


About SDSAH

South Dakota Sportsmen Against Hunger (SDSAH) helps to fund and promote the donation of wild game and fish to families facing hunger throughout South Dakota. It is a successful partnership between hunters and anglers, the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish, and Parks, Game, Fish, and Parks Commission, SDSAH, Feeding South Dakota and participating meat processors and food pantries.

SDSAH game donations by sportsmen and women include not only deer, as a primary program, but also include donation of antelope, elk, Canada geese, fish, and pheasant. The variety of donated game meat and fish is very much appreciated by families who receive it, as indicated by testimonials from food pantries which distribute the meat.

The total amount of game meat donated this past year from all sources was 18,615 pounds. This now brings total pounds of meat donated through SDSAH since inception in 1993 to over one million pounds, or over four million meals of meat to South Dakota families.

Check-off Program

Hunters are to again be recognized for donating funds to SDSAH through the Department of Game, Fish, and Parks Hunting License Application Check-off Program. A total of \$27,419 cash donations were made in fiscal year 2022.

In recent years these funds have helped SDSAH cover the cost of the Processing Certificate Program in which hunters may use processing certificates available from SDSAH game processors to pay most or all of the cost of processing donated antierless deer, doe/fawn antelope, and Canada geese. In addition, the donated funds have been used towards the cost of salvage processing game deer taken in city deer reduction programs, etc.

Credit also goes to hunters who paid the full cost of processing other donated game such as buck deer, buck antelope, and pheasants.

Success of SDSAH can be attributed also to game processors who have participated in SDSAH and provided incentive to hunters to donate by reducing the cost of processing donated game. When coupled with the SDSAH Processing Certificate Program there was often no cost to the hunter.

This past year the 16 game meat processors who cooperated with SDSAH were instrumental in delivering processed meat to Feeding South Dakota food banks and to local food pantries which then provided the meat to families facing hunger in our state.

Chronic Wasting Disease Testing Policy

For the second year the SDSAH deer and elk donation program required that all donated deer and elk taken in South Dakota west of the Missouri River, in Sully County, or out-of-state, be tested for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). Even though public health officials have found no link between CWD and any neurological disease in humans, the SDSAH Board of Directors still wanted to take steps to minimize risk of human exposure to CWD.

To accomplish the required CWD testing, additional cooperation and effort was requested and received from hunters, game processors, and Department of Game, Fish, and Parks. The result was that of 66 deer tested, two tested positive whereby the meat was destroyed. The remaining meat was processed and provided to food pantries associated with Feeding South Dakota.
